
Distribution of Muse concerts around the world from 1994 to 2023

Human development index map in 2015




 Cultural barrier reinforced by the economic aspect




World relief map

II) The global impact of culture in globalization

1) Extent of cultural phenomena

- A global cultural phenomenon is an integral part of globalization

- Therefore : the productions generated will also have a global and immediate impact

World exports of albums and derivative products :



- Contributes to financial exchanges and the export of merchandise in the world

2) Culture, flow generator

- Generation of flows of people and equipment to concert venues
